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**A Rare and Monumental Rock Crystal Globe**, making it one of the largest outside a museum collection, with superb occlusions, color and clarity, raised on a later base, the rock crystal that makes up this piece was quarried from the relatively small but still productive quartz mines in Sassari Province, Sardegna, Italy

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**A Pair of Unusual 19th Century Italian Ecclesiastical Reliquaries**, each carved in giltwood with diadem cresting above

diaper and acanthus motifs surrounding a framed window in which the reliquaries would be displayed on embroidered pillows, one reliquary in this pair removed but the other intact in a locket, purportedly a small swatch of the wimple of St. Catherine of Siena, circa late 14th c., the whole raised on a tripartite acanthus baluster and base

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**A 19th Century Bronze of the Dying Gaul** from the Greek bronze sculpture of 225 BC and the 19th Century bronze created



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by Benedetto Boschetti, this sculpture now mounted on a custom

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**A Pair of Imposing Early French Empire Recumbent  
Sphinxes**, carved from solid variegated celadon marble and

each a female with a human face and a lion's body draped in an elaborate ceremonial mantel and with their long tresses in tightly rolled braids in the front and a chignon in back, raised on a simple rectangular plinth

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**A Mid 19th Century Belgian Oil on Panel by Eugene Joseph Verboeckhoven, 1798-1881**, world renowned as the premier painter of sheep, this painting entitled Return of the Flock, Verboeckven's other works in the collections of many world museums, including The Hermitage Museum, St. Petersburg, The Wallace Collection, London, as well as museums in the United States

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**A Late 18th Century English Sable Tortoiseshell Decagonal Tea Caddy**, accented with pewter stringing and bone banding,

the top accented with a shaped sterling handle and the front with a pique sterling ovoid medallion fitted with two interior lidded compartments, fully foiled and designed to raise and lower simultaneously with the tea level and with one compartment for green tea and the other for black, the whole raised on a bone veneered plinth

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**A Large Late 18th Century French Niello Valuable Box inscribed “D’Apres Saint Albin”**, depicting the account of the Royal Court of Louis XV by the Comtesse de Genlis, Stephanie-Felicite Du Crest Saint-Aubin, the educator and memoir writer of the upper classes in the late 18th c. and early 19th c., most famous for her quote “Familiarity is the most destructive of all iconoclasts”. Niello is an etching used in decorating in black on silver and copper (and sometimes gold) that is somewhat related to champlevé work except that the effect is metallic rather than vitreous. Here the design of a court recital is engraved in exquisite detail into the fused copper and silver plates, the indented portions originally filled with a black matte alloy and became fused in the grooves creating the contrasting design

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**A Pair of 19th Century Imari Porcelain Covered Jars**, in inverted pear shape with melon-ribbed body and dome covers



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with ball finials, the surface hand painted with floral motifs in  
tones of coral and blue

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**A 19th Century Bronze Neoclassical Roman Figure** draped in Senate Robes and seated in a contemplative position, raised on

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**The 19th Century Oil on Panel, The Italian Boy by Hubert von Herkomer**, the German born British Social Realist Painter who studied at Southampton School of Art, the Munich Academy and the South Kensington Art School. Although von Herkomer received large sums of money for his portraits, he continued to produce social realist paintings like this one and Pressing to the West (1884), Hard Times (1885) and On Strike (1891). Von Herkomer was knighted in 1907 and died in 1914. His work is represented in the National Portrait Gallery in London.

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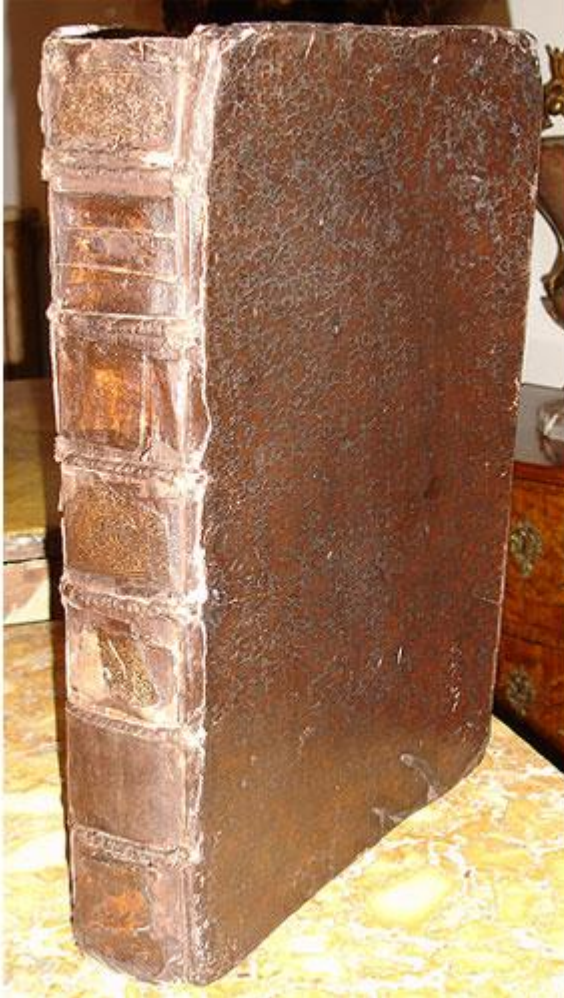
